Overview of Legal Internship Position

Job duties include reviewing and analyzing documentary evidence in Spanish; summarizing and translating key portions of documents into English; conducting legal research on legal questions arising in international arbitration matters, U.S. legal procedure and human rights law; organizing evidence for use at trial, and assisting Chadbourne attorneys in preparation for trial and motion practice. The job could also include research and assistance related to business opportunities and potential cases.
